The main news items we would like to share with you this month are: the chicks, our World Book Day celebrations, Miro and Banksy inspired art, and the fascinating visits we've had from parents.



#### Feathered fun with our chirpy chicks!

We received eleven embryo eggs and were thrilled to see all of them hatch by Thursday of the first week. We saw some of the chicks emerge from their shells, before being moved to the brooder box, and cared for them over the fortnight.

Laughter filled the room as they flapped their little wings and climbed over one another to get to the food placed on the newspaper. It's incredible how gentle all the boys and girls have been with our visitors. Handling the chicks under careful adult supervision is a really positive experience for everyone; we all learnt quickly how important it is to be quiet and respectful.

Observational drawings were created in the art room, noting changes in the chicks' appearance since they were born - their wing feathers were different, their feet were bigger and when they stood up they were much taller.

We were delighted so many children invited their parents to meet the chicks at pick up time. This is the first year that we organised the chicks to be here over the weekend that we hold the Spring Fayre and we will definitely do it again. It inspired a collaborative piece of chick art – thank you Ariana, Luca's mummy, for painting the background scene to which feathers were then attached.



Harry's grandmother supplied us with another very interesting item (the last one was a badger's skull when we were exploring skeletons) to go with the chick theme - an ostrich egg, which had come all the way from South Africa. The size comparison was enormous with the eggs the chicks had emerged from. Thank you so much; the children were very careful with the egg shell.

















#### Spreading the joy

New bark was delivered for the garden. The children eagerly watched as the mechanical arm transported two large bags of bark over the garden wall. Excitement filled the air as they eagerly set to work spreading it around the garden. They brought all sorts of containers to be filled, including wheelbarrows, buckets, and even some teacups!



# Brushes and Bansky: A Sprouting Tribute to Artistic Mischief

In the art room we ran a project on the artist Miro. We looked at some of his works and used them as inspiration for our own paintings. As an extension to this topic, we learnt about living artists and then Diana read about the latest Bansky work in Finsbury Park where she grew up. We looked at his tree mural: a woman holding a pressure washer, having apparently sprayed green paint up the side of a house. Viewed with the tree in the foreground, the green paint mimics the foliage of the plant which has been pollarded. This inspired us to come up with a large scale art work on a similar theme. We offered the boys and girls an assortment of green paint, paper, crayons and twigs along with a photo of the latest Banksy tree painting. We explained how no-one knows who he is as he does his paintings in the middle of the night. The children's response looks wonderful and is currently adorning one of the puzzle room walls.

We thought Banksy should know about the ACE tree so we sent a message to his email address (amusingly it is presscontrol@pest controloffice.com). A response was received, "Diana, We love this. Thank you for sending it to us. It made us all smile."



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## Parent visits ignite curiosity


Thank you to everyone who has been in to share their professions and interests with the children. It's really inspiring and we're confident that future scientists and musicians will credit you with having sparked their career interests at ACE!



Tanya (Chehrie), visited us to share about Nowruz, the Persian New Year. Celebrated widely across Iran, Afghanistan, the Balkans, parts of Turkey, central Asia and parts of the Arab World it marks the start of the new year and coincides with the Spring equinox. Tanya brought in objects used to set their new year table and introduced us to each one, including garlic for health, a mirror for self-reflection, an apple for beauty, coins for wealth, oleander for love and hyacinths for renewal. The book of poems by Hafez symbolises wisdom. We also enjoyed dancing to Iranian music.

Rachael (Iris), talked to us about road safety. She read a book on the topic and brought in road signs she had made for us to play a matching game with. We reinforce road safety with the children when we are out on trips e.g. discussing safe places to cross roads. The <u>ROSPA website</u> <u>(Royal Society for the</u> Prevention of Accidents) has lots of useful information about how parents can talk to young children about road safety.











Geoff (Iris) came in with his band mate Helen and a variety of instruments. They introduced the different sounds to the children (guitar, clarinet, melodica and some percussion instruments) through a range of songs that we joined in with.



Ed (James) told us about a surgical robotic arm called Versius and how it is being used to make surgery easier. We started with a conversation about what surgery is, why we might need it and who does it. We played the game Operation to illustrate how hard it is to do surgery and then looked at the robotic arm as a way of assisting the process. It doesn't get tired like a surgeon might!



Charlotte (Thomas) came in to tell us about her role as a scientist. She explained the safety measures that are taken at work (e.g. wearing goggles and white coats) before demonstrating some mixing and separating experiments with pens and food dye. The children had a go at moving liquids in pipettes into petri dishes and test tubes, as well as onto chromotography paper. Charlotte kindly left us with spare equipment to experiment with at ACE.
